ITALIAN **DIMINUTIVES**

- Diminutives are usually used to indicate that something is small in size/quantity/quality/importance/etc.
 - The 3 most common suffixes to build a diminutive are:
 -ino, -etto, -ello.
- As far as the meaning is concerned, much depends on our vision of the world, but the examples below are generally used and accepted by all speakers as "smaller+positive":

Letto - lett**ino** (smaller size)
Scarpa - scarp**etta** (smaller size)
Bassa - bass**ina** (smaller size)
Albero - alber**ello** (smaller size)
Casa - cas**etta** (smaller size)
